Ebbsfleet Garden City will be the first new Garden City for 100 years.

Up to 15,000 new homes, a vibrant mixed-use city centre, two secondary and eight primary schools, seven city parks and a range of community and leisure facilities are planned across four new urban districts by 2035.

Building on a striking, post-industrial landscape of riverbanks and chalk cliffs, Ebbsfleet Garden City will be a healthy and dynamic place of active citizenship, inclusive growth, and seamless connection to green space and nature.

The Ebbsfleet Development Corporation (EDC) was established in 2015 to deliver the Garden City, which brings together the four development areas of Ebbsfleet Central, Swanscombe Peninsula, Northfleet Riverfront, and Whitecliffe, as well as embracing the existing communities of Swanscombe and Northfleet. EDC is backed by government to forward fund the infrastructure and invest in growing communities. Ebbsfleet Garden City assets will eventually find a home with Ebbsfleet Garden City Trust, a charitable landlord with a vision for long-term stewardship of land and facilities which will support the growth of engaged, empowered, and cohesive communities.

Residents, workers, and visitors will enjoy a rich arts, culture and leisure scene that is co-created with partners and participants – a place of things to do, as much as things to see. A place in which culture is conceived, produced, and shared with communities on-site, off-site, and online.

The potential for arts and culture in Ebbsfleet is extraordinary.


It is a strong location, with easy connectivity to London and Europe, ambitious partners, and a supportive funding, planning and development climate, surrounded by a backdrop of chalk cliffs sloping toward wide open riverbanks.

Ebbsfleet Garden City sits at the heart of the Thames Estuary Production Corridor, a regional partnership – stretching from East London through the Kent and Essex coasts – that promotes investment in creative and cultural production.

With the support of Creative Estuary, a consortium of public sector and cultural organisations dedicated to delivering the Production Corridor vision, the region will be transformed into one of the world's most exciting cultural production hubs. A strong network of anchoring facilities exists in places such as Chatham, Thurrock, Purfleet, and Dagenham spanning film, artists and makers, digital and creative media, theatre and dance, with additional sites and opportunities being developed. Ebbsfleet is positioned to deliver significant new production facilities within the estuary while joining a growing ecosystem which will create opportunities across the creative industries.

Cultural organisations and creative individuals have easy access to large markets in London, Europe, and the rest of Kent. It is just 19-minutes by High Speed Rail to London St. Pancras International from Ebbsfleet International Station, which also has direct connections to Paris, Brussels, Bruges, and Amsterdam.

Ebbsfleet is the ideal environment to accommodate organisations of any size to operate in different ways, at multiple levels - the chance to be hyperlocal and purpose-led, while still accessing a global market. It is a place that allows collaborative innovation with local communities that can still reach audiences at a regional, even international scale - a place where product and programming is cocreated with the community, refined through experiment and collaboration, and promoted worldwide through physical experiences and digital reach.





The vision for culture in Ebbsfleet is backed by the Ebbsfleet Garden City Trust, which ensures long-term community involvement in the stewardship of land and assets and universal access to facilities, guided by cultural and community development outcomes and accountability measures. Ebbsfleet Development Corporation and Ebbsfleet Garden City Trust are together creating a place for people to fully engage with arts and culture - where every plan and policy is geared to support 'active Ebbsfleeters' who are encouraged and enabled to connect with cultural programming as active participants.

This crossroads identity has defined the history and heritage of Ebbsfleet, as well as its current form and function. That story is written into the archaeology of Anglo Saxon settlements and Roman roads, in tales of travelling saints and Norman conquest, from Elizabethan harbours and Georgian villages all the way through the Industrial Revolution and the modern marvel of High Speed One. It is distinguished by the confluence of road, river and rail and the changing relationship between people, nature,

and technology. Ebbsfleet Garden City is the next chapter of that story.

Through investment in next-generation production and data infrastructure, and the co-location of cultural creative and technical talent. Ebbsfleet will connect the local and global, physical product and digital reach, personal experience, and mass participation.

It has the scope, the creative energy and technical skill to be a gateway between the real and the virtual - a coming-together of access and engagement in physical and digital space, finding new forms and expressions to enrich our physical-digital hybrid lives. This is a role that has become increasingly important since the Covid-19 pandemic, where culture, civic engagement, and active participation is carried out in equal measures on- and off-line. Even the slowest adaptors have reckoned with the need for both digital and physical programming – where each is different, but of equal importance.

Ebbsfleet is a place of soul and inspiration. A proud industrial heritage of open guarries and man-made canyons is the canvas for re-wilding projects and a playground for exploration of history, landscape, and the natural environment. Lush green fields and tidal waters are punctuated by docklands, shipping cranes, disused kilns, and cliffside tunnels. Artists find inspiration in this flourishing scenery and rich heritage. Children have space to roam and play. Everyone is able and encouraged to participate in its planning, design, and stewardship.

For cultural organisations that have made a priority of people and community, health, and environment. Ebbsfleet is the ideal location. It is - as it has always been - a gateway and a crossroads, connecting people, places, and ideas.


